SNAPP Indirect Cost Guidelines

Founded in 2013, the Science for Nature and People Partnership (SNAPP) is a premier innovation engine of conservation science and sustainable development policy and practice, partnering with public, non-profit and private sector organizations around the world to transform the relationship between people and nature. Backed by The Nature Conservancy and the Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS), SNAPP funds, convenes and supports Expert Working Groups addressing challenges in four focus areas: Climate Resilience, Food and Freshwater, Ocean Sustainability and Social Innovations.

Since its inception, SNAPP has maintained a published Indirect Cost Guidelines that funds awarded by the program are subject to 0% indirect cost rate. This guidance is a contingency of SNAPP funding and applies to both the primary recipient and any sub-grantees.

SNAPP funds may be applied to fringe benefits and other direct costs associated with conducting the work.
